Common Diagnoses of Joycare's Patients

Joycare provides services to children with many medical conditions—the primary requirement is the need for ongoing skilled nursing oversight to manage the condition. This list represents **SOME** of the common diagnoses.

Other phrases we see in the clinical notes include: *Feeding Problems (Suck/Swallow Disorders), Prematurity, Very Low and Low Birth Weight, Chronic Lung Disease, Colostomy/Ileostomy Care, Diabetes, Renal Failure, Trach Dependent, Brain Injury, Neurological Disorders, Cardiac Disorders, Immune System Deficiencies, IV Infusion Management and Medication Administration, Genetic Disorders, Syndromes, and Rare Diseases.*
